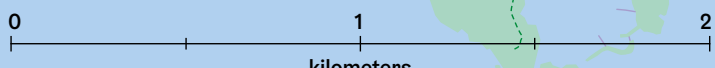
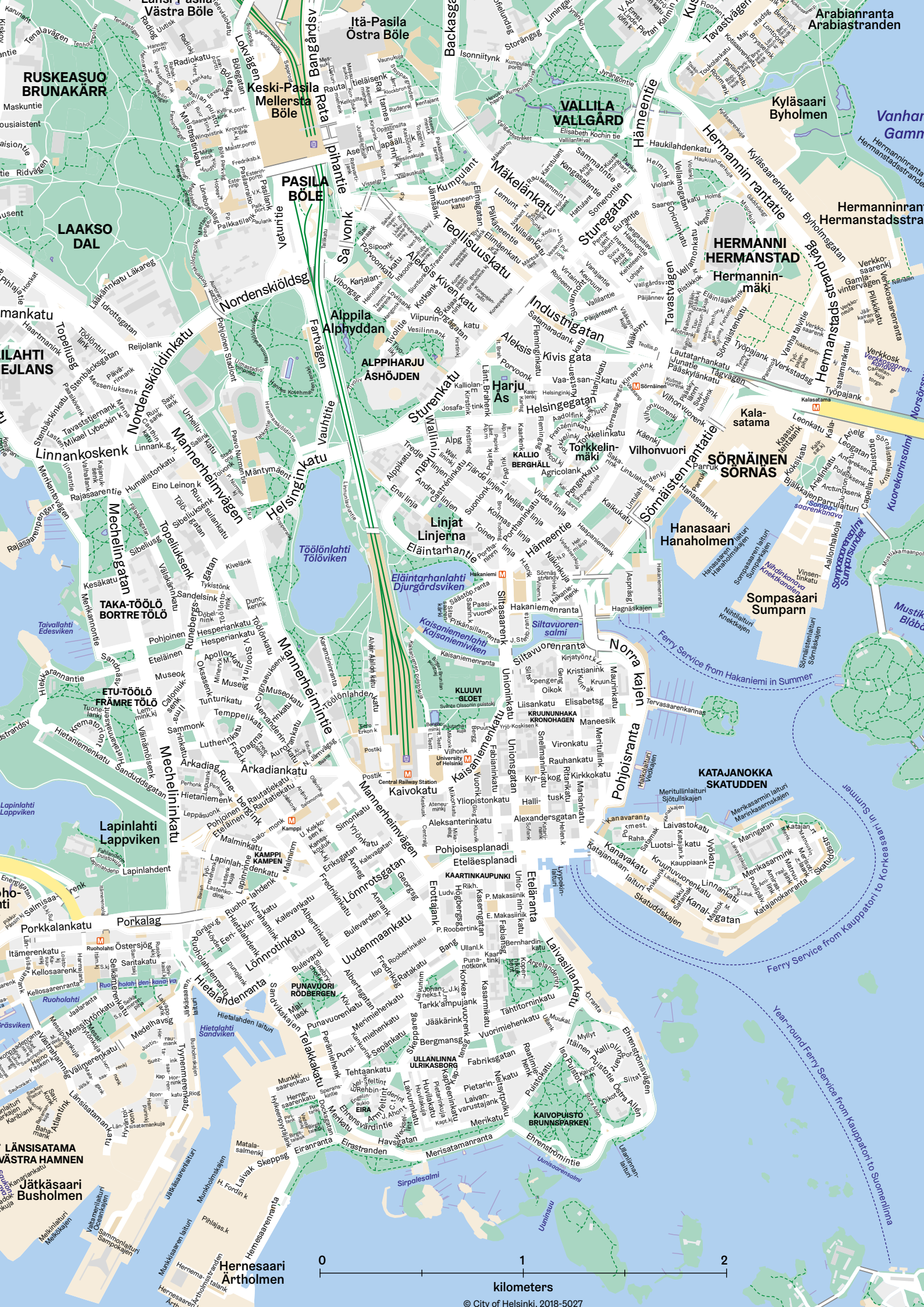

Capacity: 16,500 beds

Most hotels are located within 1.5 kilometres of city centre. Usually breakfast is included in the room rate.

Airport: Helsinki Airport is located 19 km/ approx. 30 min. from city center.

Accessibility: Helsinki City Transport's Tourist Ticket offers unlimited travel on all public transportation within Helsinki. 1-day tickets can be purchased from bus drivers (cash only), vending machines, R-kiosks and the Tourist Information office. Tickets and fares: hsl.fi

Trains: Ring Rail Line connects long distance trains to the airport and allows quick and easy access to the city centre (30 min.). **I trains** operate from Helsinki via Pasila to Tikkurila and the airport and back to Helsinki. **P trains** operate from Helsinki via Pasila and Huopalahti to the airport and back to Helsinki via Tikkurila. Single ticket: 5.50 €

Finnair City Bus: operates between Helsinki Airport (Terminal 1 platform 11, Terminal 2 platform 10) and Helsinki Railway Station (Elielinaukio, platform 30) every 20 minutes. Single ticket: 6.60 €

Taxi: from the airport to Helsinki costs around 40 €.

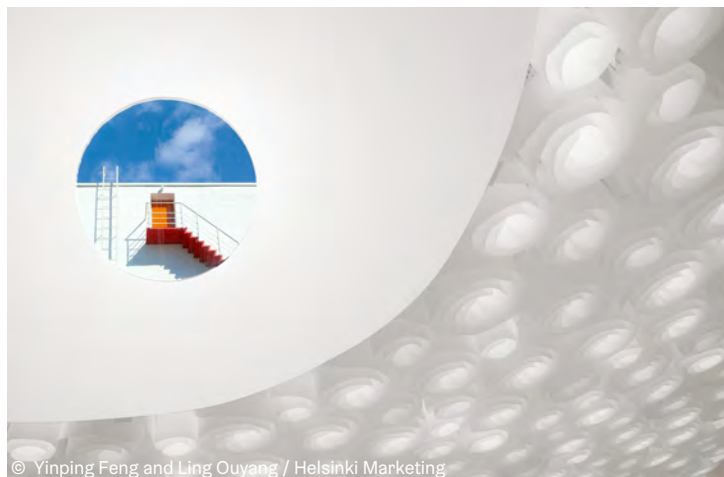

Amos Rex

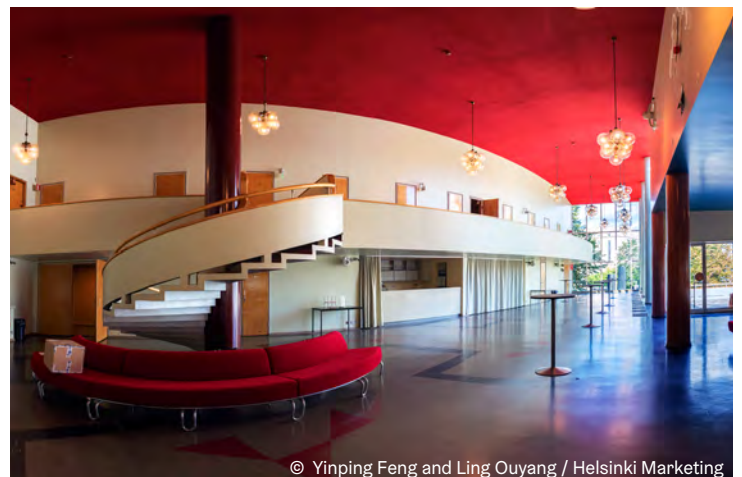

Helsinki Top Attractions

Torikorttelit & Helsinki Cathedral

The historic quarters that lie between the Market Square and Senate Square are home to numerous cafés and restaurants. Quaint boutiques at the Torikorttelit sell beautiful Finnish design and handicrafts.

On the other side of the Torikorttelit is the Senate Square and the most recognizable building in the city, Helsinki Cathedral, the neoclassical masterpiece designed by the architect C. L. Engel.

Market Square & Old Market Hall

A great place to start exploring the historic center is the Market Square, where the items on sale are dictated by the seasons. In summertime, you can taste fresh Finnish strawberries, in the autumn you can stock up on pickled herring, and in wintertime, you can enjoy a hot cup of coffee in one of the warm tents. The adjacent Old Market Hall is packed with fragrant delicacies all year round, and you may enjoy a delicious lunch there.

Esplanade Park & nearby flagship stores for Finnish design brands

The Esplanade has been the main promenade for the past 200 years, and people still flock to the park in summertime to sit on the lawns and terraces. Free concerts are held throughout the summer on the Espa Stage. The streets alongside the park boast designer brand shops, both local and international. Finnish design brand Marimekko offering variety of clothing, interior decoration textiles and specialty items, Iittala's timeless glassware, and the new flagship store for Finnish design TRE, that provides design, furniture, lifestyle products, organic cosmetics and fashion.

Island hopping - Visit Suomenlinna, Lonna, Vallisaari & Isosaari

Suomenlinna is one of the biggest sea fortresses in the world, founded in 1748. Suomenlinna remains one of the most popular attractions in Finland and was included in UNESCO World Heritage List as a unique monument to European military architecture. Numerous museums and restaurants. Open all-year.

Lonna is a sweet little island between the Market Square and Suomenlinna, only a seven-minute ferry ride away from the mainland. The little sister of Suomenlinna was used at a time for making ships immune to sea mines. The restaurant at Lonna is highly recommendable for lunch or dinner.

Vallisaari island, situated next to Suomenlinna, used to belong to Finnish National Defense Forces and it's known for its beautiful nature with versatile flora. Isosaari island, a pearl in the outer archipelago of Helsinki, has been a landmark for sailors and as a base for fishermen, later a military base and a research centre. Nowadays as a tourist and nature attraction it offers sandy beaches, saunas, restaurant Upseerikerho with a beautiful sea view, a 9-hole golf course, a guest harbour and a tent area.

Design District

Design is deep-rooted in the everyday lives of Finns, ranging from world-famous designer items to modern urban solutions in the city and contemporary architecture. Helsinki was awarded with the UNESCO's City of Design status 2014. Design District Helsinki is a lively neighborhood with 25 streets and 200 spots on a map from shops to galleries and from design studios to design hotels.

Temppeliaukio Rock Church

Quarried out of the natural bedrock, this church is one of Helsinki's most popular tourist attractions. The interior walls are created naturally by the rock. Due to its excellent acoustics the church is a popular venue for concerts. Entrance fee 3 €/person.

Seurasaari Island

The open-air museum of Seurasaari is located on a beautiful lush island just a few kilometers from the heart of Helsinki. The island is a tranquil nature haven in the midst of the city and at the museum the traditional Finnish way of life is displayed in the cottages, farmsteads and manors of the past four centuries that have been relocated from all around Finland.

Museums

Kiasma is a museum of contemporary art. Its primary role is to educate the public on contemporary art and to strengthen the status of art in Finland in general. A lively cultural centre and meeting place, Kiasma is the place for pleasure and experience.

Ateneum is the most popular museum in Finland. The collections include Finnish art from the 1750s to the 1960s and western art from the latter half of the 1800s to the 1950s, including many national treasures.

HAM, officially the Helsinki Art Museum, looks after an art collection that belongs to the people of Helsinki, which includes over 9,000 individual works of art. HAM maintains and accrues this art collection, which also includes the city's public artworks. In its domestic and international exhibitions HAM showcases modern and contemporary art.

Helsinki City Museum is the world's only museum focusing on Helsinki. Personal experiences and daily life in the Helsinki of the past are reflected in permanent and changing exhibitions, with a Time Machine and in Children's Town.

Enjoy the Finnish sauna culture in Helsinki!

A sauna by the sea or lake is not only a Finnish dream come true but also an essential part of the way of life here. There are only 5,4 million Finns but 3,3 million saunas. In recent years, Helsinki also has got new public saunas where visitors can get the true Finnish sauna experience.

Löyly – an urban oasis

In Löyly (meaning the steam that comes when you throw water on hot stones in a sauna) Helsinki offers both a public sauna experience all year round! Relax in different saunas or enjoy drinks, snacks, lunch or a proper dinner at the restaurant. Exceptional architecture in a unique location on the beautiful Helsinki waterfront.

Allas Sea Pool

Allas complex brings together swimming, saunas, urban culture and sustainable development and provides a centre of good life in the heart of the city. The Baltic Sea Center introduces the life forms and the protection of the Baltic Sea and Archipelago.

Lonna

The public sauna pays homage to traditional sauna culture. Both saunas, heated by large wood-burning stoves, can accommodate up to 20 guests at a time. From a large terrace where you can cool off and enjoy the beautiful view of the surrounding islands.

Saunasaari

An island with three different "smoke" saunas with a view to the city. It's reserved mainly for groups and corporate hospitality.

Kotiharju Sauna

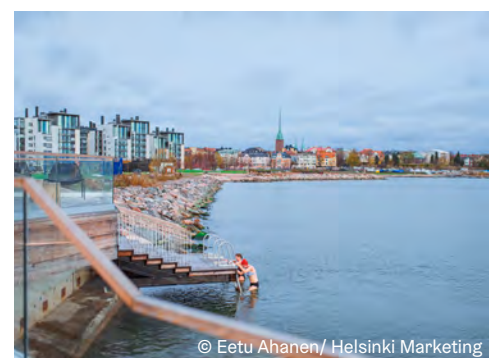
This traditional wood-heated neighborhood sauna in Helsinki has welcomed sauna lovers since 1928. Massages and other treatments are also available.

5.-9.1. Lux Helsinki

Lux Helsinki light festival offers a brilliant experience for all the senses during the darkest time of the year. This free of charge city event includes impressive light installations and fire art. luxhelsinki.fi

9.3. Helsinki Sauna Day

Helsinki Sauna Day will open the doors to the private saunas of local residents and companies to all who are interested. helsinkiusaunaday.fi

30.4.-1.5. May Day Festivities

On the eve of May Day, students gather at the Market Square to wash the statue of Havis Amanda and place a student cap on her head. The following morning everyone gathers in Kaivopuisto Park for a picnic and more sparkling wine. Parades are also held around town.

18.5. Helsinki City Running Day

Finland's biggest running event, also Mini Marathon for children. helsinki-city-marathon.fi/helsinki-city-running-day

12.6. Helsinki Day

Helsinki will once again celebrate and entertain residents and visitors on its birthday. Helsinki Day offers lots to see and do for people of all ages and the city centre will be filled with music and lively events. helsinki-paiva.fi

21.-22.6. Midsummer Festivities

The biggest celebration takes place on the Seurasaari Open Air Museum Island on Midsummer Eve June 21. On the following day June 22, visitors can participate in activities on the Seurasaari Island

such as folk dancing and traditional games. The event is free of charge. Another celebration in town takes place on the island of Pihlajasaari island, with a 20-minute ferry connection from Merisatama harbour. Programme includes e.g. bonfires and dancing, and the idyllic restaurant on the island will also stay open through the evening.

28.-30.6. Tuska Open Air Metal Festival

The biggest heavy metal festival in Northern Europe takes place in Helsinki featuring some of the biggest names in metal. tuska-festival.fi

June-July, Helsinki Pride

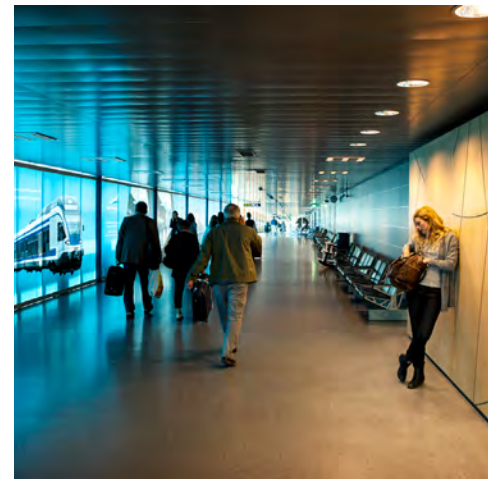
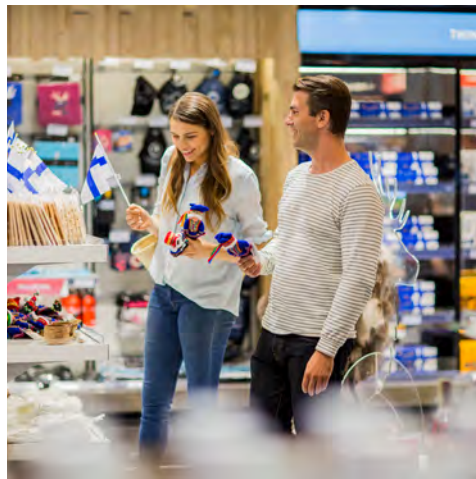
By ferry

Helsinki Festival is the largest arts festival in Finland and a landpost in the city's cultural calendar, celebrated in August in 2019.

Organized annually in late summer, the festival fills Helsinki with art and culture from free events to high-end concerts and shows. The programme lineup features classical, pop and world music, theatre, dance, circus and visual arts as well as a range of urban events. One of the festival highlights is the beloved Night of the Arts, which every year fills the streets, parks, stores and galleries with free art till late in the evening. In 2019, Night of the Arts takes place on Thursday Aug 22nd.

Helsinki Festival events take place in a variety of locations from the Helsinki Music Centre to theatre stages and museums around town. Music enthusiasts also get to enjoy late summer evenings in the atmospheric Huvila festival tent erected by the Töölönlahti bay. The festival tent offers concerts as well as food and drinks every festival evening.

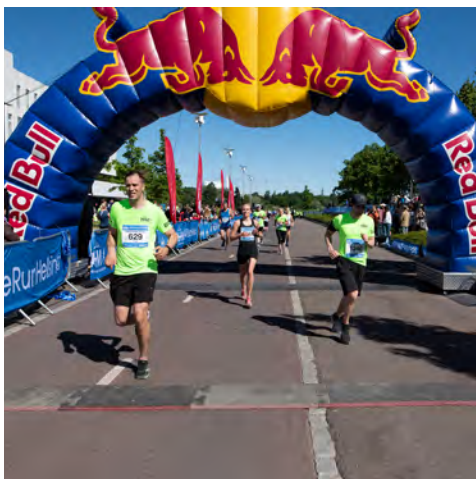

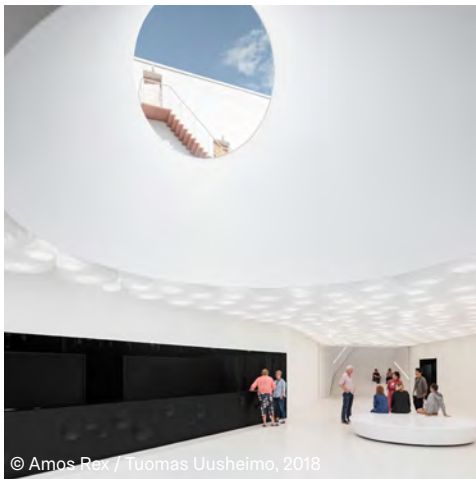

Oodi is a venue for events, a house of reading and a diverse urban experience.

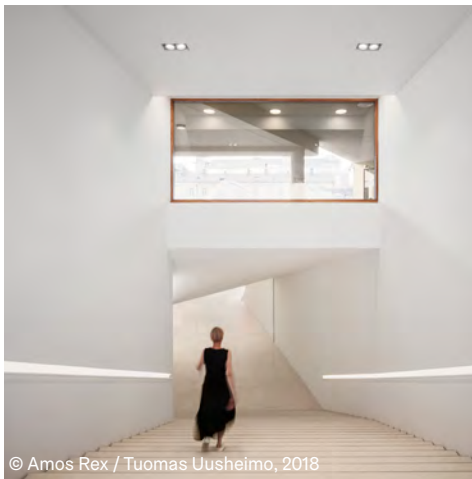

Amos Rex

Background and History

Amos Rex is a private art museum whose construction and operations are funded by Amos Anderson's Föreningen Konstsamfundet association. Amos Rex's predecessor, the Amos Anderson Art Museum, functioned on Helsinki's Yrjönkatu in 1965–2017 in the former home and offices of the art patron and newspaper publisher Amos Anderson (1878–1961).

Art Museum

Amos Rex is an art museum with unique architecture that was opened in central Helsinki in August 2018. Amos Rex consists of new underground exhibition spaces, the old Lasipalatsi (glass palace) from 1936 and its Bio Rex cinema, as well as a vibrant event forum on Lasipalatsi Square, which serves as the roof of the exhibition hall.

Exhibitions at Amos Rex

Amos Rex's exhibition programme extends from the newest, often experimental, contemporary art to 20th-century Modernism and ancient cultures. The goal is for the past, present and future to produce unique experiences and sur-

prising encounters beneath and above ground, and on the screen.

Several cafés and restaurants are located in the same building. In addition, there is a museum shop, a movie theatre and a free cloak room for visitors.

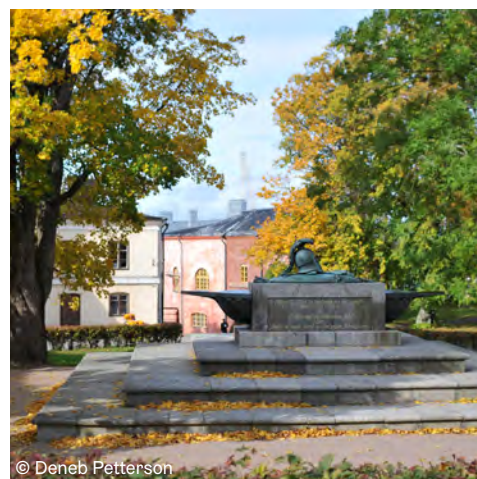

The Governing Body of Suomenlinna

The Governing Body of Suomenlinna is a government agency operating under the Ministry of Education and Culture. Responsible for managing the Suomenlinna sea fortress World Heritage Site as a visitor attraction and residential area (including restoration, maintenance and development).

Suomenlinna Sea Fortress

Suomenlinna is one of the biggest sea fortresses in the world, founded in 1748 and built on islands of the coast of Helsinki. Suomenlinna remains one of the most popular attractions in Finland and was included in UNESCO World Heritage List in 1991 as a unique monument to European military architecture.

Today Suomenlinna is one of the foremost attractions in Finland but also a lively community of some 800 residents. The fortifications and old garrison buildings have been restored and converted into residential properties, studios, meeting and banquet venues, restaurants and museums. Six kilometres of walls, 100 cannons, exciting tunnels, events, beautiful parks and views overlooking the sea provide memorable experiences.

Accessibility

Ferry trip to Suomenlinna from Helsinki's Market Square takes only fifteen minutes. The trip gives an excellent opportunity to enjoy the scenery and photograph Helsinki from the sea.

Note

Visiting the fortress is free of charge. Visitors only need to buy a ferry ticket for the ferry (part of the city public transportation system, operates throughout the year) or the water bus (operates from May to September).

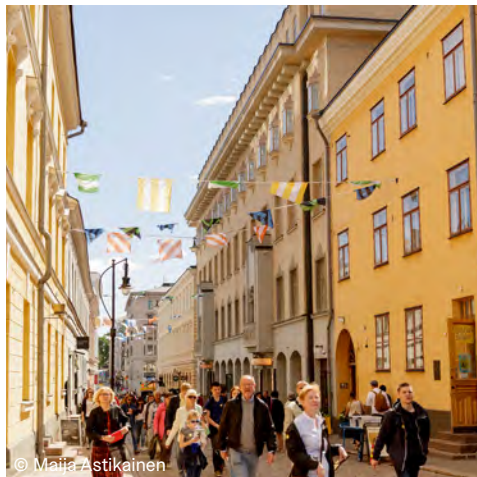

Torikorttelit

The Torikorttelit compounds are developed and leased out by Helsingin Leijona, the property development company owned by the City of Helsinki. The large-scale renovation and enlivenment project is a historical re-envisionment that has opened up Helsinki's governmental building blocks to new life. The compounds offer a total of 12,000 square metres of commercial spaces and 3,000 square metres of courtyard areas.

Experience the new life of historical Helsinki. The Torikorttelit area consists of three oldest blocks in the heart of Helsinki, right by the sea. Torikorttelit is a must-see destination for food enthusiasts and design fanatics.

It's also a true paradise for friends of architecture and history buffs. Its layers of history go back to the periods of both Russian and Swedish rule. New layers are being added right now: maritime Helsinki by the Market Square and the Torikorttelit is experiencing a renaissance.

The three blocks of buildings with their lovely courtyards were in administrative use for over 40 years, but now the large-scale renovation and enlivenment project has opened up Helsinki's governmental building blocks to new life. The compounds offer a total of 12,000 square metres of commercial spaces and 3,000 square metres of courtyard areas. The Empire style blocks have opened up Hel-

sinki to new life and have attracted many new and interesting ventures to the area.

Take a stroll through the Torikorttelit courtyards, make discoveries in the boutiques, indulge in the culinary pleasures of the restaurants and cafés, be impressed by culture.

Highlights

Torikorttelit has become a hot spot for some of the most exciting restaurants in town. Altogether 19 cafés and restaurants are located within the buildings as well as the event venue Valkoinen Sali. The supply is abundant: Finnish and Scandinavian classics, breakfasts and brunches, pizza, pasta, a brewery and a speakeasy. In the summertime the enjoyment spreads to the many terrace areas in the courtyards as well as the streets.

The one-of-a-kind street level shops at the old buildings showcase a wide spectrum of artisanal know-how from traditional to modern. Torikorttelit is a great place to get to know Finnish design as well as many emerging Finnish brands.

The events are an important part of the yearly calendar of Torikorttelit. The Helsinki Christmas Market together with the empire style blocks create an atmospheric Christmas town during Yuletide. During the summer the courtyards are filled with concerts and other events.

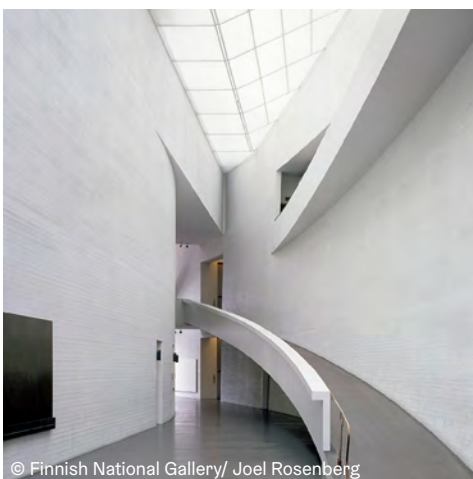

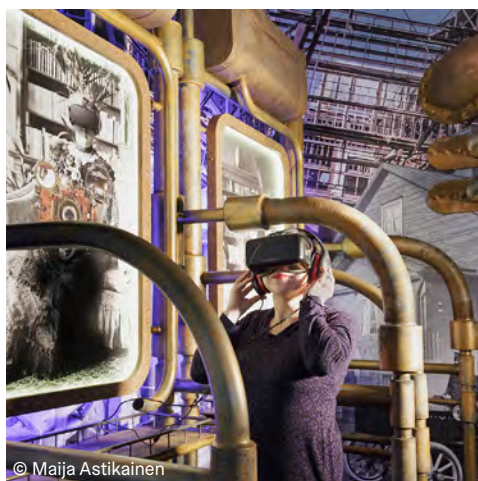

Helsinki City Museum

The Helsinki City Museum is the world's only museum focusing on Helsinki. Personal experiences and everyday life of people in Helsinki are highlighted and reflected in the museum's items and photographs. In the City Museum, everyone has the opportunity to fall in love with Helsinki. Always free entry.

The museum consists of five buildings from different eras, a new building linking them, and three fine inner courtyards. The buildings have many types of spaces and atmospheres, heart-warming details and new perspectives to the city's oldest quarters.

Journey through Helsinki's history

The journey through Helsinki's history starts on the first floor, where images captured by photographer Signe Brander a century ago come to life in the museum's time machine. The City Museum's collections contain more than a million photos of Helsinki, including many taken more than a century ago. Snapshots obtained from family albums and many professional photographers have been compiled in the museum's picture archives. An online version of the archives has more than 40,000 images for viewing.

Children's Town

Visitors of all ages can freely touch and feel all the objects displayed in the Children's Town section on the 2nd and 3rd floors. Here kids can play, draw, try on costumes, go to school

in an old-fashioned classroom, and visit a granny's house from the 1970s. The Children's Town has been created in Sederholm House, the oldest building in the museum complex, built in 1757.

Helsinki Bites exhibition

The Helsinki Bites exhibition on the second floor takes museum-goers back to a typical Helsinki home in the 1950s and a local bar from the 1970s, to a soundtrack of old songs related to the city and radio broadcasts from the fifties.

These include several ultra-modern sauna complexes have opened in Helsinki recently, attracting locals and visitors alike. Try, for example, the local Sauna

Arla in Hermanni, the cultural Kulttuurisauna in Merihaka and the old-fashioned Kaurila sauna in Meilahti. If you wish to experience sauna without getting wet, visit Allas Sea Pools or Löyly design sauna. They both have nice restaurants and terraces where you can relax and see how others enjoy sauna.

The Finnish sauna is for cleansing and relaxing. Although saunas involve nudity, this has nothing

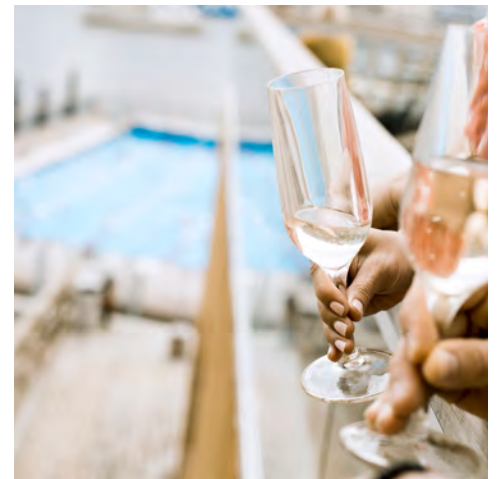
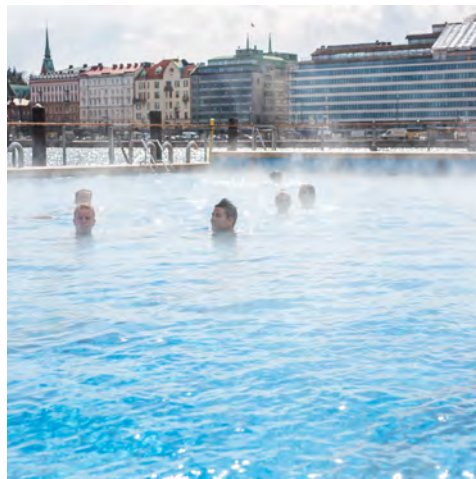
to do with sex. Nudity is natural, and you shouldn't be ashamed of your own body. Still, if you prefer to wear a swimsuit or towel, that's your prerogative – and in some public saunas it is even required to do so. You are allowed to speak freely and socialise, but it's also quite normal for Finns to sit quietly in their own thoughts.

The big (25m x 15m) pool and the pool for children are both filled with heated fresh water (27°C/80.5°F). This means that you can get an authentic ice swimming experience in the winter time at Allas.

One sauna for women, one for men and one shared sauna. The shared sauna can also be reserved for private events. Saunas are electrically heated with solar energy and the temperature is about 80°C/ 176°F.

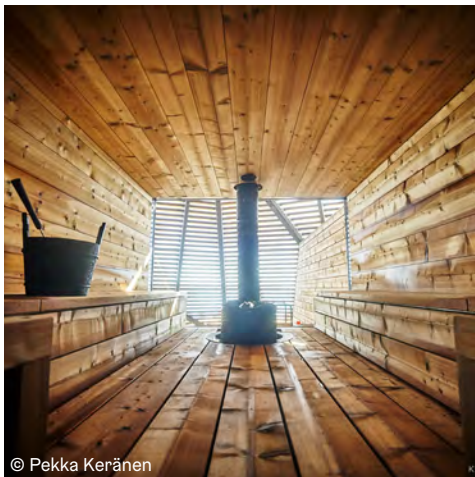

Yrjönkatu Swimming Hall

The swimming hall was inaugurated on 4 June 1928. For decades it was Finland's only public swimming hall. The hall is architecturally valuable, serving as an impressive example of the classism of its time. Over the decades it has retained its original appearance.

There are separate swimming sessions for men and women, with bathers having the choice of whether to wear a swimming costume or not. The option to wear a swimming costume became available from September 2001.

Outdoor Swimming Pools

During the summer, the City of Helsinki has two outdoor swimming pools: Helsinki Swimming Stadium and the Kumpula Outdoor Swimming Pool. Both places are great opportunity to swim, exercise and relax under the summer sky.

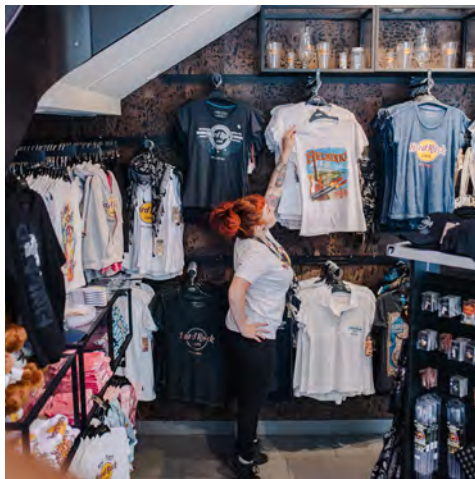

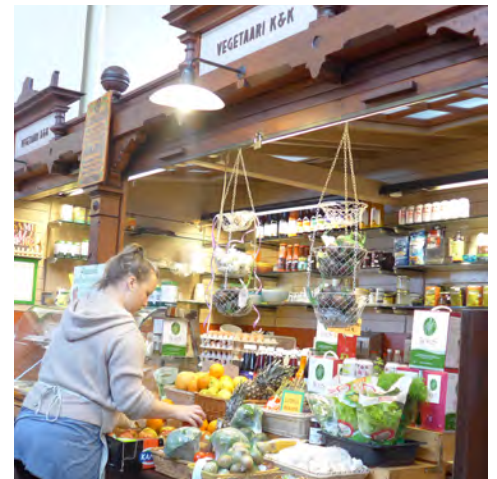

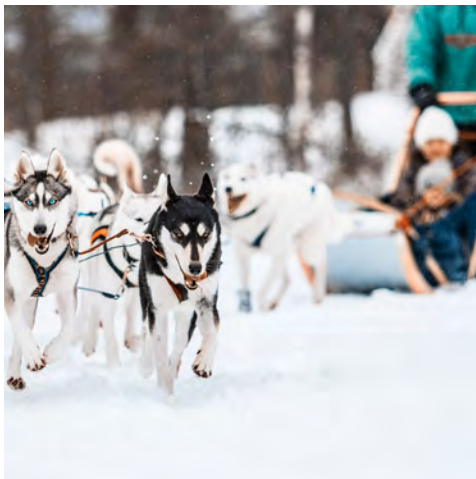

Vantaa is the home city of famous Finnish chocolate brand Fazer. **Fazer Experience Visitor Centre** offers experiences for all the senses, guided exhibition tours and chocolate mini-tastings.

Heureka, the Finnish Science Centre is located in Tikkurila and introduces the public to science and technology in an engaging and interactive way. Visitors can experience the

joy of discovery through spectacular exhibitions, planetarium films and events.

The Finnish Aviation Museum is a treasure chest of aeronautical information. The collection includes dozens of aircraft related to the history of Finnish aviation and flight simulators offer virtual flying experiences for all.

Church of St. Lawrence is the oldest building in Helsinki region. The district, **Helsingin pitäjän kirkonkylä**, is regarded as an important cultural and historic site, as it remains one of the best preserved parishes in southern Finland and the original settlement within Greater Helsinki.

Flamingo Entertainment Center together with **Jumbo Shopping Centre** offer multiple choices to spend an hour or two. The complex near the airport offers variety of entertainment activities (e.g. movie theater, spa, bowling, laser games, virtual experiences) and 120+ stores under its roof.

Arts - Vantaa art museum, located in Myyrmäki concentrates on graffiti and street art. Myyrmäki is known for its murals and graffiti. **Myyrmäki Church**, often referred to as the Church of light, designed Juha Leiviskä is also situated in Myyrmäki.

Nature lovers head to **Kuusijärvi Lake** recreational area (20 min from the airport). You can swim and sauna all year round. There are

two smokes saunas and electric saunas. A walk around the lake (1 km) is very relaxing. In Summer you can follow hiking paths and in the winter there are skiing tracks all the way to **Sipoonkorpi National Park**.

Visit Vantaa Tourist Information

Visitor information is available at our Citizen Services (Vantaa-info) in Tikkurila, Korso and Myyrmäki. Also from Helsinki region tourist information at Helsinki Airport in arrival hall 2A you can pick up brochures and maps and get tips on what to do close to the airport.

Vuosaari

Vuosaari lies only a 20-minute commute from both the city center and the airport. You can reach Vuosaari by bicycle, car or subway. Additionally, at summer Vuosaari is accessible by sea via a scheduled boat service. Vuosaari Harbor naturally functions as the welcoming point for ferries bringing in European explorers from as far away as Travemünde, Germany.

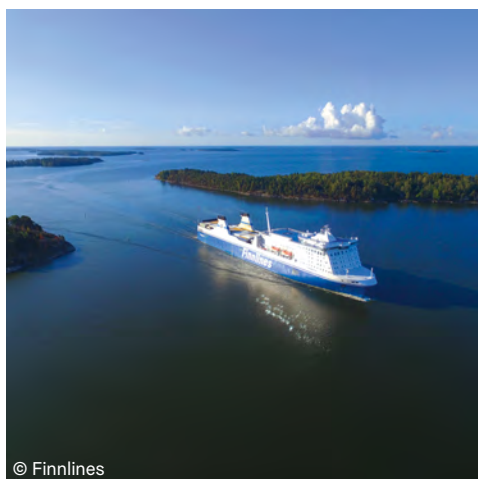
Activities at sea, nature & sports centers
